STUDENT PLACEMENTS: CHANGING OF THE GUARD

Batshaw Youth and Family Centres has had a long and enriching experience providing placements for students in the helping professions. Our main focus has been on students in Social Work and Child Care/Special Care Counselling. Students wanting experience in Therapeutic Recreation, Education, Art and Drama Therapy, Criminology, Psychology and Counselling have also been placed, mostly in the residential services divisions. The main teaching institutions which have been our partners for social work have been McGill University and Dawson College. In child care education and special care counselling, Vanier, John Abbott and Champlain CEGEPs, have had a long association with us.

The supervision of students has been generously provided by our staff who have given their time, energy, knowledge and dedication to guide students in their chosen professions. In the academic year just ended, we have had 22 Social Work students, (McGill 19, Dawson 3) supervised by 19 staff members. In Child Care/Special Care Counselling in 13 residential units, there are 26 students, (Vanier 13, John Abbott 11, Champlain 2).

The responsibility for student placement and orientation has traditionally been with the Professional Services division. The Human Resources and Administrative Services division will now assume these responsibilities. Anna Renda is the Student Co-ordinator since June 1, 2001, and Kim St. Hilaire will develop the Orientation Programme. Anna can be reached at 989-1885.

As the Social Work Student Co-ordinator for several decades, on a personal note, I would like to thank all the supervisors and members of the co-ordinating committee for their support and patience to help me do my job. I enjoyed the freshness and enthusiasm of the students, many of whom are now staff members. My thanks also to the programme managers in Residential Services and Placement Services for Young Children for their patience and support in teaching me about their services and responding promptly to requests from DPS and facilitating placements. SCHOOL BASED INTERVENTION: TWO COLLOQUES

Batshaw is part of a group of agencies sponsoring two visits to Montreal of Dr. Steve Edwards, well known American educator and administrator. He is the prinicipal of an inner city high school in Hartford, Connecticut. At one time the school was overwhelmed with every conceivable teenage and family problem. Dr. Edwards developed the school staff team and program, and the external partnerships necessary to turn the school around. Today, it is a successful model of what can be achieved. He has important lessons for us about how the education, mental health and child welfare sectors can work together (rather than pass each other their problems). As well as how we can prevent problems from becoming worse, and make significant improvements in the school climate, and the lives of individual students and their families.

Dr. Edwards will be here on Wednesday, August 15th to address school principals, administrators and agency supervisors. He will return on Thursday, November 15th, as the pre-conference speaker at the teachers' convention, to speak to teachers, mental health and child welfare front line workers, and anyone else who is interested. In addition he will be available to give consultations to the staff teams from different schools.

Batshaw's partners in this endeavour are the Social Service Department of the Montreal Children's Hospital, Park Extension CLSC, Baron de Hirsch Institute, the Association of Administrators of English Schools of Quebec, the Quebec Provincial Association of Teachers, the Lester B. Pearson School Board, and the English Montreal School Board. If you are interested in attending, call your divisional contact person.
