BATSHAW FOUNDATION ANNUAL CAMPAIGN

RENOVATIONS FINISHED AT LAST!

The renovations at 6 Weredale Park are finally finished. The project lasted a few months beyond its original schedule, but the wait and inconvenience suffered by all our staff in the building, and their visitors, was worth it. The main entrance has been completely redone, with better waiting areas, meeting rooms and washrooms. In addition, the auditorium has been redone, air conditioned, and has a modern audio-visual system to support meetings and special events. Below the main level there has also been a complete revamping of the gymnasium, and installation of a staff fitness centre, which functions by membership, and already has over 100 members.

Projects of this kind often raise questions to be asked about the financing, particularly whether it has a negative effect on program dollars. The answer is no. *Did you know that* each year we are invited to submit our construction and equipment priorities to the regional board? When we receive grants for projects (such as 6 Weredale Park) it is from a large envelope of money which is never used for programs, is only used for construction and equipment needs, whether ours or those of another institution.

Sometimes we have to cover some additional unforeseen expenses from our budget. When that happens it comes from inside the Batshaw maintenance budget. That can make maintenance a little tighter, but does not have a significant effect on operations. Monies for clinical services are not touched by this process. This way of operating means we have to spread our projects over several years. But one by one, we are upgrading the buildings we use. Meanwhile, we thank Jean Belhumeur, Jean Tremblay and their team for helping us weather using a building in the midst of major renovations and producing a great result.

NEW CARD ACCESS SYSTEM

Over the next several weeks, BYFC access will be in transition from 'slide' card to 'proximity' card. All employees will need an ID card that is compatible with the new technology. The 'proximity' card will allow access by simply 'showing' the card to the new reader. The new technology will provide Batshaw Security with a user friendly and secure program for managing building access.

The transition began with 6 Weredale Park and is proceeding throughout all locations. Human Resources has published a schedule indicating the dates and locations for acquiring the new 'proximity' ID card. During this period, all employees will have two cards, as they may need access in different locations. Please be aware that there may be "glitches" as the new program gets 'broken in' and therefore your patience and support will be appreciated.
