YOUTH SEXUAL EXPLOITATION

It's been a year now that the Batshaw Board adopted the policy and procedures on "Sexual Exploitation of Youth: Prevention and Intervention".

This is a reminder about this policy. No matter what service you are in, if you are aware of a situation where you believe a young person is being exploited you must:

- a) Signal the matter to the Director of Youth Protection: (514) 935-6196.
- b) Inform your manager about the situation who, in turn, will inform the BYFC Resource person on STI/HIV and youth sexuality, Lynn Dion (Dorval Campus: 636-0910 extension 142 or by e-mail: lynn_dion@ssss.gouv.qc.ca).

One of the measures put in place by the procedures was the identification of a centralized staff person to whom all "sexual exploitation" situations are to be reported. The purpose of this procedure is to assure that all the information we have collectively is seen by one person who can detect trends. The central person has the responsibility to track information and trends, and be the liaison with the Police Service of Montréal that permits close collaboration. This procedure in no way replaces the responsibility under the law to signal to the Director of Youth Protection any situation where it is believed that a child is at risk. It is an additional measure to be taken afterwards.

Based on the information received over the past year, the Police Service of Montréal conducted investigations that lead to the arrest of alleged pimps and recruiters. Everyone's support and cooperation is crucial to provide more protection for our youth clientele.

RESOURCE KIT ON SEXUAL ORIENTATION FOR EDUCATORS AND YOUTH WORKERS

There is an activity guide providing a variety of ready-made strategies for awareness raising, intervention and discussion on various aspects of the subject. This is a very useful tool that supplements the training course entitled "For a New Understanding of Homosexuality".

EQUIP: A SUCCESS STORY

In December 2005, CFCF aired a broadcast on the EQUIP Program that told the story of two Youth Centre clients: Alexandre, who received no follow-up after turning 18 and Kamil, who participated in the EQUIP Program. On February 28, employees were invited to a special presentation of this broadcast, followed by a discussion with the producer, Kamil and Danny, the educator who supported her throughout the program. Given the length and intensity of the program, EQUIP is certainly unique. Kamil stressed the importance of a "one-on-one" approach versus group workshops. She gave as an example an activity designed to prepare them for grocery shopping that took place in a closed room with flyers and compared it to her own experience with Danny at the supermarket.

Kamil described the trusting relationship she developed over the years with her educator. Danny supported her every step of the way and helped her develop a network that would allow her to meet all of her needs once she lived on her own. Kamil won over employees who were touched by her story and applauded her courage.
